


THE MANDATORY HIJAB IS ITS BANNER

In the name of religion, some islamist theocraties impose an inferior status to women and a radical separation between men and women, which equals to sexual apartheid.



August 15th 2021: the Taliban regain power in Kabul and impose their deadly fatwas on women.



September 16th 2022 in Iran: the death of Jina Masha Amini following police brutality for "improper wearing of the veil" triggered an uprising throughout the country.

The Olympic Charter:

Fundamental principe n°4:

(...) Every individual must have the possibility of practicing sport, without discrimination of any kind (...)

Rule 50.2 : No kind of demonstration or political, religious or racial propaganda is permitted in any Olympic sites, venues or other areas.

Its racial apartheid regime resulted in South Africa being excluded from the Olympic Games for thirty years, and a sporting boycott by all nations.

- Convention on the Suppression and Punishment of the Crime of Apartheid (1973)
 - Convention against apartheid in sports (1985)

The Paris 2024 Network URGES

the International Olympic Committee

To refuse the participation of countries imposing sexual apartheid and/or the wearing of a costume reflecting religious affiliation, <u>practices contrary to the Olympic Charter.</u>

the Organizing Olympic Committee

Within the framework of its duties, to ensure compliance of athletes with the Olympic Charter.
